



NVCA Middle School Accountability Program – P.R.I.D.E. Program **(Personal Responsibility In Daily Efforts)**

There are two different ways that students show strong character at North Valley Christian Academy and this is by doing their work diligently and by treating others respectfully. There are two important ways that NVCA can assist their students in developing strong character and this is by encouraging positive behavior and discouraging negative behavior. At the middle school level, we call this program P.R.I.D.E. The letters stand for Personal Responsibility in Daily Efforts. P.R.I.D.E. is designed to motivate and challenge students in positive directions. P.R.I.D.E. also recognizes and rewards students who meet certain goals. This is how it works...

At the end of each quarter (October, January, March, and May) NVCA middle school students will be recognized as members of P.R.I.D.E. if they achieved the following standards during the nine weeks:

1. No more than six days of absence (including family trips, doctor/dentist appt., and partial days)
2. No more than one unexcused tardy
3. No behavioral referrals/In-house referral
4. Receive all “Yes” Stamps on the student’s P.R.I.D.E. Card for the nine weeks (2 grace stamps will be given each nine weeks)

Students who become members of P.R.I.D.E. will receive recognition and will also be invited to a planned celebration of their accomplishments. Students need to take 4 or more classes on campus or take a minimum of 3 core classes to be eligible for P.R.I.D.E. The PRIDE program works in conjunction with the North Valley Christian Academy school-wide positive behavior intervention system (PBIS).
